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

Benefits Update

Important Pharmacy Information

Please remember, effective Jan. 1, 2019, EpiphanyRx began administering the Clarksville-Montgomery County Employee Insurance Trust (CMCEIT) prescription drug benefits through BlueCross BlueShield of Tennessee (BCBS of TN).

Although Epiphany is the new Pharmacy provider, you will still have only one insurance card. New insurance cards were issued by BCBS of TN in December and mailed to members' home addresses. The new insurance card looks very similar to the old card so please be mindful and ensure the old card is destroyed and replaced with the new insurance card.

It is very important that you provide a copy of your new insurance card to your pharmacy when obtaining a prescription. If your doctor calls in your prescriptions, you will want to provide your doctor's office with a copy of your new insurance card, as well.

The new RXBIN and RXGRP numbers are listed on the front of your new insurance card. Epiphany's website and phone number, for Pharmacist and Member Services, are listed on the back of the card.

CMCSS Retirement Informational Meetings

Medical Flexible Spending Account

All participants in the MedFSA plan, will have until March 15, 2019 to incur expenses for 2018 balances. You will then have until March 31, 2019 to submit claims to Benefits Connection. Any claim received after March 31, 2019 will not be eligible for reimbursement. Remember that you can shop at https://fsastore.com to spend any remaining 2018 funds.

2019 Contribution Maximum for 401(k) and 403(b) Retirement Accounts

The Internal Revenue Code limits the amount you can contribute each calendar year to 401(k) and 403(b) retirement accounts. The federal general limit is \$19,000 for 2019. If you are age 50 or older, the general limit contribution amount may be increased by an additional contribution of \$6,000.

Mayor vs. General Second Annual Broomball Event at Downtown Commons Ice Rink

The public is invited to attend the second annual broomball match between Montgomery County Mayor Jim Durrett and Fort Campbell's Major General Andrew Poppas to a backyard broomball game on Jan. 16 at 6 p.m. at the Downtown Commons Winter Ice Rink.

Broomball is a variation of ice hockey played on ice without skates and with brooms and a ball instead of sticks and a puck. Running around in shoes on ice while trying to "sweep" a ball into a goal presents a unique challenge that includes a lot of slipping, sliding and falling.

Last year General Poppas and his team were victorious. Mayor Durrett and his team will work to score the win this year. The game will be emceed by Scott Chase with 5Star Radio. Food and drinks will be available at Golly G's, located on site, or at a variety of restaurants in the downtown area. Page's Clarksville Sporting Goods is sponsoring the equipment for the event.

"Wednesday night's event is an opportunity to cheer on the County team and our local heroes from Fort Campbell. It's going to be a good time for everyone," said Mayor Durrett.

The Downtown Commons construction was not completed when the 2018 Broomball Game was played which limited the amount of space people had to view the game. Completion of the outdoor event venue in April 2018, opened up the one block area. The last day to skate at the Downtown Commons Winter Ice Rink will be Jan. 21 as they close out with a Luau theme ice skating party.

Moore Magnet Elementary STEM School

STEM, which stands for science, technology, engineering, and math, is embedded kindergarten through 5th grade at Moore. Students apply the knowledge they gain across the curriculum to solve challenges aligned with real-world problems tied to local community issues. Moore was one of the first schools in the state to receive the prestigious Tennessee STEM School Designation. Additionally, Moore was the first Montgomery County Green Certified School.

Barksdale Elementary Spanish Immersion Option

The Spanish Immersion program is a proven method of educating children by immersing them in the Spanish language so they become bilingual. In a language immersion program, the classroom environment becomes the setting for language acquisition through subject content instruction, educational discourse, and social interactions. In the 2019-2020 school year, the Spanish Immersion Program will be enrolling a limited number of kindergarten students. Students who enter the program need to be committed to continuing Spanish dual-language learning through 5th grade at Barksdale.

Academies of CMCSS

They are college and career preparatory small learning communities in which a select group of students focus their core class experience around a common career interest. Students share many of the same teachers, allowing educators to collaborate with each other in the coordination of lesson planning and classroom activities that align to the academy theme. Incoming high school freshmen and rising sophomores will have the opportunity to apply to eight different college and career academies across the district.

Through grants and scholarships, Middle College students are not required to pay tuition nor do they incur the expense of college textbooks.

Students who qualify can use funding from TNPromise to complete TCAT diplomas following HS graduation.
