

Bowl for Kids Sake

The 36th annual Bowl For Kids Sake, benefiting Big Brothers Big Sisters (BBBS) of Clarksville will be Saturday, April 6 at the Pinnacle Family Entertainment Center. BBBS has introduced mentoring programs into three CMCSS schools so far, serving 19 children in school-based matches, and hopes to grow the number of children paired in a life-changing relationship with a mentor. BBBS currently has more than 50 children total paired with mentors in the community.

Fundraisers like Bowl For Kids Sake help BBBS recruit and train volunteer mentors and support matches in strong and enduring relationships.
